Keynote Presentations






Friday, February 16 President's Dinner 7:00 pm

Additionally, the Mauna Lani South Course was awarded the 2022 #1 Public Golf Course in the United States by GolfPass.com.

On the loop trail you'll encounter two streams with seven waterfalls, three bridges, and ancient Hawaiian terraces and flumes along the famous Kohala Ditch, providing a glimpse into the rich history and culture of the islands. The easy hiking offers countryside views, with a chance for a swim in a private mountain stream with cascading falls overhead. Lunch provided.

Experience the beauty of Hawaii like never before with our Pololū Valley adventure tour. This remarkable excursion offers a rare glimpse at the pristine Hawaiian landscape and the history and legends that have inspired it. Join us on a guided tour along the rim of Kohala's northern-most sacred valley - the Valley of the Long Spear, Pololū.

Your 5-seat off-road "utility task vehicle" (UTV) will meander makai (towards the sea) through the lush pastures of a working cattle ranch before journeying mauka (towards the mountains) where cool mists, verdant forests, waterfalls, and rushing streams await. This eco-activity is the perfect way to explore the beauty of the Hawaiian landscape while learning about the culture and history that have shaped it. Take a walk through time as we explore the story of Kona coffee, starting from its roots with Henry Nicholas Greenwell in 1850 when he left England and first set foot on the fertile soil of rural Kona. Together with his wife, Elizabeth Caroline, Henry spent the next forty years farming, ranching, and perfecting his Kona Coffee, soon exporting it to Europe and the Americas.

The farm is currently managed by the descendants of Henry and Elizabeth, and has evolved into a multi-faceted agribusiness.

While exploring the farm's facilities, you'll see everything from their own pulping and drying facilities to their green-bean grading and storage facility. And with their roasting plant on-site, you can rest assured that every bag of coffee is freshly roasted before it's packaged and shipped around the world. Of course, no coffee plantation tour is complete without the chance to sample this delicious brew and the opportunity to take some home from their coffee store.


