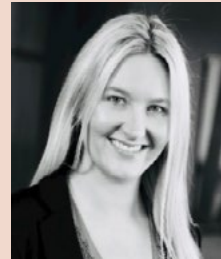
Dave Murk, Senior Director of Pipelines

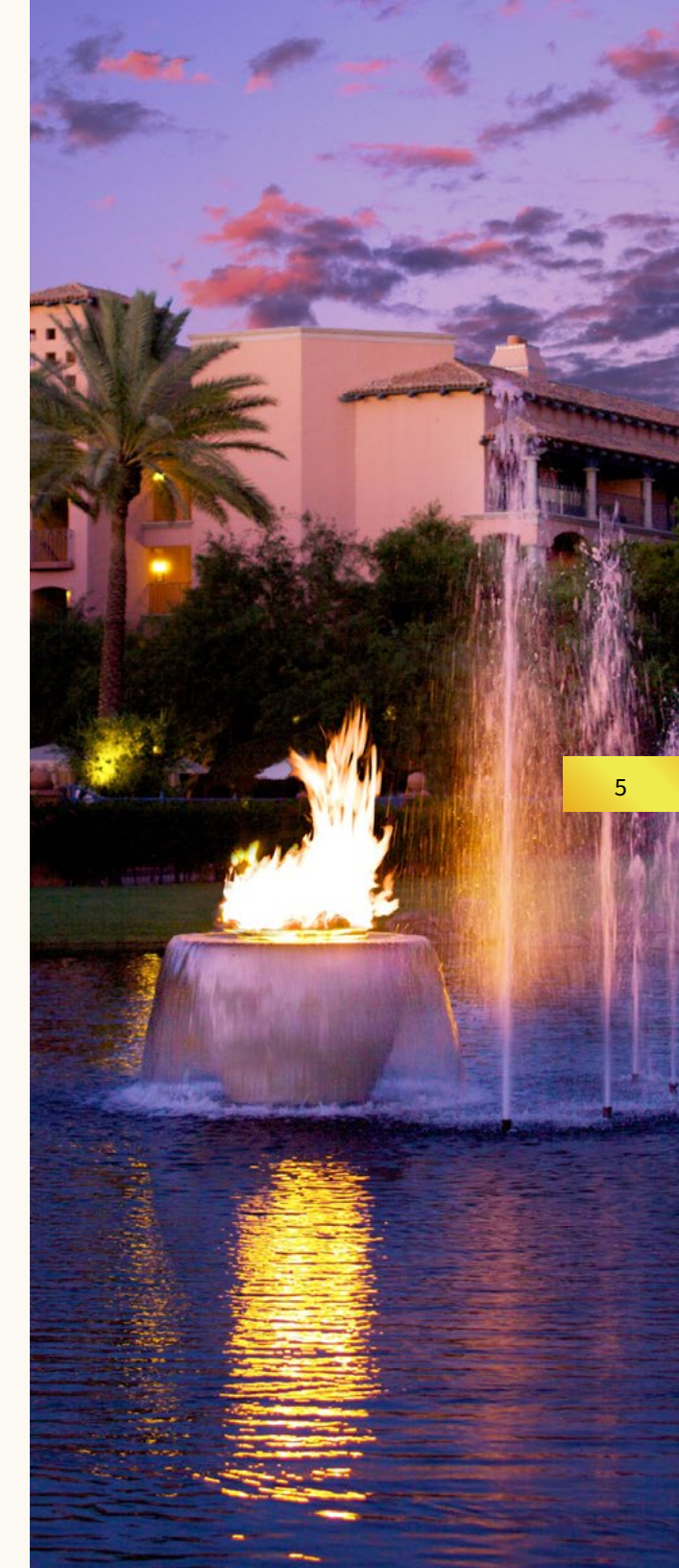
