Milwaukee Mitchell International Airport (MKE) is the closest international airport to Lake Geneva, located 50 miles from the resort. Driving time to Lake Geneva takes approximately 1 hour.

Another convenient airport is Chicago O'Hare International Airport (ORD) located 70 miles from the resort. Driving time from O'Hare to the resort is approximately 1.5 hours.

Renting a car is recommended from both airport destinations for the most convenient travel experience. While Uber and Lyft services may be available, availability can vary depending on the time of day and demand.

Golf Outing at The Highlands Golf Course

Tuesday, July 15th Tee Times: 12:15 pm – 1:05 pm

Wide open fairways. Lighting quick greens. Bring your best golf game. The Highlands is a Scottish-inspired, links-style course, complete with a beautiful landscape of scenic hills, trickling creeks and lush foliage. This Lake Geneva golf course was originally designed by Pete Dye and Jack Nicklaus; transformed in 1996 by Bob Cupp. The Highlands' short par 4s will challenge your club selections and strategy; depending on the tees you play, anything from a driver down to a hybrid will be an option. The course provides an outstanding golf experience, weaving and rolling through the glacier-formed terrain of Southwestern Wisconsin yet transporting golfers to Scotland.

Boat & Black Point Estate Tour

Tuesday, July 15th Departure: 12:45 pm – 4:45 pm

Built in 1898, the Yacht Polaris is the oldest boat on the lake and a true piece of Lake Geneva history. Step back into the style and elegance of the lake's turn-of-the-century golden age, surrounded by original mahogany and brass trim, along with a brass-top bar.

Arrive in style while enjoying the stunning Geneva Lake views on your cruise to this magnificent summer home, Black Point Estate. Built for Chicago Beer Baron, Conrad Seipp in 1888 as a retreat, it is considered one of the finest examples of period architecture and furniture in the Midwest and one of the oldest homes in Lake Geneva.

Yerkes Observatory

Tuesday, July 15th Departure: 1:00 pm – 3:30 pm


In 1892, a brilliant, young professor of astrophysics at the then-new University of Chicago learned of two 40-inch telescope lens blanks collecting dust in a warehouse. They were just what George Ellery Hale was looking for to build the observatory of his dreams. He convinced the university's president, William Rainey Harper, to acquire the lenses and secure what was essentially a blank check from Chicago tycoon Charles Tyson Yerkes to build a different kind of observatory. Yerkes Observatory, housing not only a telescope but also laboratories, workshops, and libraries, first opened its dome to the night sky in 1897, and soon attracted the brightest lights of astronomical science. The study of astrophysics may have been a reason why Yerkes Observatory hosted one very famous visitor, Albert Einstein, during his first trip to America in 1921.

Today, Yerkes remains unsurpassed as the world's largest refracting telescope allowing you look through what is still one of the most powerful telescopes available to the general public.

Lake Geneva Ziplines

Tuesday, July 15th, and Wednesday, July 16th Departure: 12:15 pm – 4:00 pm

Lake Geneva's biggest rush, fly through our 100-acre property on 9 unique ziplines, 5 sky bridges, 4 spiral staircases all through the treetops. The final zip is a dual line allowing two people to race each other down a zipline 1,221 feet long while taking in skyline views of Lake Como!

Participation requirements: 7 years old, weight 70-250 lbs, and at least 4 foot tall.

Fishing Lake Geneva

Tuesday, July 15th, and Wednesday, July 16th Departure: 12:30 pm – 5:15 pm

Lake Geneva is one of the most beautiful lakes in Wisconsin. It is the second deepest lake in the State at 142 feet. Its crystal clear water is fed by many fresh water springs. Lake Geneva is a well balanced fishery including Walleye, Smallmouth and Largemouth Bass, Northern Pike, Lake Trout, Brown and Rainbow Trout, White Bass, Perch, Crappie, Bluegill and Cisco.

Lake Geneva has produced many trophy Walleye over 10 pounds, Northern Pike, up to 30 pounds and Trout exceeding 15 pounds. The Smallmouth Bass population is outstanding and Largemouth Bass has been steadily increasing.

As an added bonus, while on Geneva Lake, one can enjoy the serenity and beauty of the many mansions lining the shores.

All gear provided; fishing license done separately in advance. Boxed lunch included. Hat and sunscreen recommended.
