Reno-Tahoe International Airport (RNO) is the closest international airport to Lake Tahoe, located 50 miles from the resort. Driving time to Lake Tahoe is approximately 1 hour.

Another nearby airport is Sacramento International Airport (SMF), located 115 miles from the resort. Driving time from Sacramento to the resort is approximately 2 hours.

Renting a car is recommended from both airport destinations for the most convenient travel experience. While Uber and Lyft services may be available, availability can vary depending on the time of day and demand. It is highly recommended to schedule Ubers or Lyfts if using to depart the resort and return to the airport.

Attire

The attire for the Mid Year Meeting is casual. Clothing and footwear should be appropriate for the temperature, chance of showers and activity. For any activities on the water, a light jacket is always recommended as well as for any outdoor evening events.

Please keep in mind that July is peak season in Lake Tahoe, and reservations are highly recommended.

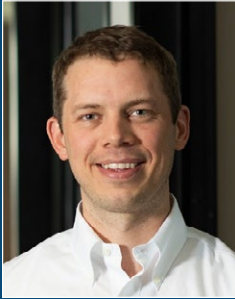

A professor at Arizona State University and active industry consultant, he has led research projects worldwide and lectured around the globe. In this session, he'll deliver a comprehensive look at where HDD has been, where it stands today, and where it's going — essential perspective for anyone working in trenchless technology.

Government Relations Committee Wednesday, July 22

Guest Speaker: Sarah Macgruder Lyle, Common Ground Alliance (*invited*)
Presentation: *Updates from CGA's Damage Prevention Institute (DPI) and Damage Prevention Action Network (DPAC)*



CGA will provide updates on two programs central to DCA members' work in damage prevention. DPI addresses systemic inefficiencies in the damage prevention process through participant accreditation, performance measurement, and peer reviews. Launched in January 2023, the program has strong contractor participation — but greater operator involvement, particularly around facility mapping and GIS adoption, remains a key priority.

DPAC advances damage prevention through legislative advocacy, public awareness, 811 promotion, stakeholder partnerships, and industry training. As excavators now represent CGA's largest stakeholder group, the conversation has expanded well beyond "call before you dig" — with a growing focus on improved facility mapping by operators. This is a discussion worth showing up for.
